The Year That Was!

Dear LAOG Members and Friends,

Oh, what a year! The year 2020 certainly roared in many challenging ways! When the Covid-19 pandemic hit, it was necessary to cancel our Roaring '20s Gala, so we never had the opportunity to "Sparkle Together." Shortly thereafter, Maryvale announced, after lengthy and heartfelt deliberations, the closing of its Short Term Residential Therapeutic Program (STRTP) at the Rosemead campus, which had been the focus of LAOG's support. Maryvale has provided residential services for the children of the Los Angeles area for over 165 years, and LAOG had been supporting their efforts for over 70 years. Now it's time for both LAOG and Marvvale to refocus their missions.

LAOG continues to support Maryvale as it works through its strategic planning process, with an emphasis on serving children and families in need. Even though Maryvale has closed its residential program, the organization continues to provide necessary services through Early Education and Community "Wrap Around" programs.

The "Early Education Program" provides a subsidized pre-school for those families and a "Distant Learning Support Program" for older children to assist them with online classes and school work while their parents work. This is a much-needed service, especially during the Covid-19 pandemic.

The "Community Wrap Around Program" provides mental health services and support to at-risk families, allowing the children to remain in a family setting, rather than a more restrictive alternative.

LAOG has decided to continue

supporting both programs to provide vulnerable families with our assistance during this transitional period.

As a result of the changes at Maryvale, donations from our fundraising efforts originally allocated for the Short Term Residential Therapeutic Program have been given to help support these two other programs. Also, LAOG recently released the 2017 Funded Item donation raised during our Safari Gala, intended to upgrade the Residential Care playground (put on hold due to campus construction) for the Early Childhood playground upgrade.

We are also pleased to announce that LAOG is able to donate \$500,000 to Maryvale this fiscal year as a result of the generosity of long-time guild member, Jacqueline Bolton. This donation was bequeathed to us through trusts established long ago. We encourage you as you review your estate planning and if you are willing and able to set aside an amount, large or small, to do the same. During challenging fundraising times such as these, Jackie's generous gift has afforded us the opportunity to continue with our annual donation to Maryvale. The Last Dance

June 24, 2020 marked the end of an era at Maryvale.

The smiles and jubilation of the commencement graduates belied the solemnity of the occasion, as this would also be Maryvale's final graduation.

Maryvale has decided to close its Short-Term Residential Therapeutic Program (STRTP), a decision driven by the enactment of new regulations regarding foster care children implemented by the State of California. The new regulations are intended to better serve children in the state's massive foster care system, but it also means the end of Maryvale's 165-year history of providing residential services to children.

Maryvale will continue to provide Early Childhood Education and Community-Based and Wraparound Services for children and families.

Each graduate gave a "Wish List" to Guild member Linda Fischer, of items they might need, as they leave Maryvale. Linda purchased as many of the items as possible, putting the gifts in suitcases, and presenting them to the girls after the ceremony. The girls were so surprised and excited. It's one of the Guild's most incredible undertakings.

The Guild also provided Nathan's Food Truck for refreshments after the ceremony.









Maryvale Programs Care for Children and Families

Early Childhood Education

The COVID-19 pandemic forced the closure of schools and many early education programs, like ours. But our Rosemead and Duarte staff members worked diligently to keep our Early Childhood Education Program open to serve our children and their families, many of whom work in health care and other essential services, to continue providing this vital foundation for academic success.

"We also launched Spotlight on FUNdamentals, an online learning program that provides videos of Maryvale teachers conducting learning and wellness exercises for families to practice at home," said Christina Moore, Maryvale's Vice President of Early Childhood Education and Nutrition.

John, a parent of children enrolled in our Early Education Program, thanked Maryvale for staying open during the pandemic and posting the videos, saying they "bring joy to my girls, and I'm very grateful for the job you all are doing."

Our Caring Community

In 1855, Bishop Amat, the first Bishop of the Monterey/ Los Angeles Diocese, became increasingly concerned about the growing numbers of orphaned and abandoned children roaming Los Angeles' streets. He petitioned the Daughters of Charity to help.

On Jan. 6, 1856, five Daughters of Charity came to Los Angeles to open the county's first orphanage and hospital in downtown. Their dedication launched Los Angeles County's oldest children's charity - an organization that has cared for our community for 165 years.

This legacy of caring continued during fiscal year 2020, even as we made the very significant decision to close our Short-Term Residential Therapeutic Program. Following all the changes the State of California implemented to better serve children in foster care, it became clear the program was not working. The outcomes for children, impact on staff and financial drain on the agency all contributed to the ultimate decision to end this chapter in the Maryvale story.

Throughout fiscal year 2020 and into the New Year, we continued to care for children and families through our Early Childhood Education and Community-Based and Wraparound Services Programs.



Our Community-Based and Wraparound Services have a life-changing impact on children and families through mental health assessments, crisis intervention, therapy, ongoing assistance and referrals to resources and services.

Among the many served this past year was George, a 9-yearold boy who was having tantrums and exhibiting difficult behaviors at school and home because of past trauma. Our therapist engaged George in play therapy, using figurines and toys to re-create his traumatic experience until he had no desire to continue playing it out.

"This is a proven approach to help children who are seeking to process trauma," said Michelle Culver, Director of Community-Based Services. "Children resolve what has not been resolved in their minds, and that can have a life-changing impact on them."

Once George could talk about his trauma, he was more capable of controlling his temper and using the skills he learned to address his anxieties. With this life-changing help, George graduated from Maryvale's Wraparound Services this past year and is now receiving outpatient care.

A Future of Possibilities

As fiscal 2021 beckons, Maryvale begins writing its next chapter by exploring a future of exciting possibilities.


For the safety of our members all meetings in the foreseeable future will be held via Zoom!
